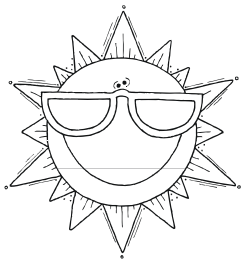

SUMMER PROGRAM 2010

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Preschool Summer Program (Open to HMS Students Only)

Preschool Summer Program (Available to incoming and continuing 3 year-olds) – Beginning June 7th and ending on July 16th, the children will be exploring and enhancing their reading and writing skills as well as their math readiness skills through hands-on-activities, music, arts and crafts, and physical activities. Biweekly excursions and weekly swimming lessons are part of this program. From July 19th through July 23rd, children will have fun-filled days, filled with arts and craft activities and excursions.

Pre-Kindergarten Readiness Program (Available to 4-year-olds entering Kindergarten) – This class is for children who have completed the 4-year-old preschool program. The classes are designed to prepare students for our kindergarten program. The emphasis will be providing additional practice in handwriting and sound-letter associations. Children will also review numbers, counting, sorting, sequencing, patterning, and age-appropriate arithmetic concepts using a variety of materials. Music, arts and crafts, and social skills will be incorporated to round out the class. From July 19th through July 23rd, the children will be in summer recess care; their days will be filled with fun arts and craft activities and excursions.

Morning Classes for Students Completing Grades K through 7 (Open to HMS and Non-HMS Students)

Beginning Japanese (Available to students completing Grades 2 - 7; Mandatory class for all new HMS students entering Grades 3 – 8 in the fall) – This class will cover basic hiragana, some commonly used words and phrases, basic grammar, and cultural appreciation of Japan before the start of new school year. The classes are divided into smaller multiage groups.

Kindergarten Enrichment (Available to students completing Kindergarten) – This is an integrated morning program for the Kindergarteners, using theme-based, hands-on activities. This class provides a variety of enrichment activities, especially in music, art, science, and drama. This class is for students who successfully completed an academically-oriented Kindergarten class during the school year.

Kindergarten Review (Available to students completing Kindergarten) – This morning program is for Kindergarteners who need to review their skills in language arts and math. This class will focus on learning to work independently as well as in a group and to apply the skills learned in practical situations. This class is for students who completed an academically-oriented Kindergarten class but still needs additional practice and review before entering first grade.

Math Enrichment (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 5) – This class is for students who seek challenges in mathematics. This class will use practical activities to enrich their knowledge. It is designed to engage students in thinking, talking, listening, and analyzing mathematics. It will allow students to go beyond computations and drills and into explorations of number relationships, patterns, geometry, and measurements and how mathematics can be used in our everyday world. Students will be placed in age-appropriate classes.

Mathematics Review (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 5) – This class is designed for students who need review and reinforcement in math. Basic computational and problem-solving skills will be reviewed and emphasized. Upon completion of this math class, students should have increased their ability to set up problems with appropriate operations; have knowledge of a variety of techniques to solve mathematical problems; and develop their ability to work cooperatively with peers on problems. Students will be placed in age-appropriate classes.

Middle School Mathematics (Available to students completing Grades 6 & 7) – Accelerate your child’s middle school mathematics skills and prepare them for the next level of mathematics. This class allows the students to practice, explore, and reflect on their math skills and knowledge through math projects and activities.

Reading/Writing Enrichment (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 5) – This class is for students who flourish in language arts: students who love to read and write. The class will provide more challenging and enriching activities in reading, writing, interpreting, listening, and speaking skills. The students will have an opportunity to explore a variety of literatures. Students will be placed in age-appropriate classes.

Reading/Writing Review (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 5) – This class reinforces language arts skills learned during the current school year. Reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills will be the focus of study. The emphasis of this class is to provide reinforcement and review using current age-appropriate literatures. Students will be placed in age-appropriate classes.

Middle School Reading and Writing (Available to students completing Grades 6 - 7) – This language arts class is for students who need further experience in strengthening their reading comprehension as well as providing opportunities for variety of writing activities. The students will be using age-appropriate literature as the basis for their writing projects. Better understanding of what they are reading as well as improving the quality of their writing will be the focus of this class. The students will also spend portion of the summer learning about time management, homework planning, note-taking, oral presentation skills, and test-taking skills.

Science (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 5)

Grade 1-3: LEGO Robotics – Students are challenged to use LEGO pieces to solve basic engineering problems. Students will be working in teams for every challenge to help one another and to work together to accomplish their tasks. Students will begin with basic challenges of what can be done and the challenges become harder each day. By the end of class, the students will be able to build and program a LEGO-based robot! There will be a separate class for first grade students. The second and third grade student will be working together.

Grades 4 & 5 – Students in this class will become inventors at a toy factory. They will learn how to brainstorm ideas for new toys, design the toys, build mock-ups, put together a business plan, and prepare marketing materials, including web pages. Because inventions are based on science and technology, we approach the creation and development of the toy idea through science and scientific experimentation. The class includes a number of toy invention activities to help stimulate students to come up with their own ideas. The aim of the class is to foster creative thinking, inventing and entrepreneurial enterprise.

Sports: Basic Movements (Available to students completing Grades 1 - 3) – This class will take the students through basic fitness concepts, movement skills, coordination, and balance activities. Using physical games from around the world, students will also learn to appreciate other cultures as well. This multi-age class will help students develop a more positive attitude towards an active lifestyle.

Sports: Conditioning, Basketball, and Volleyball (Available to students completing Grades 4 - 7) – This class is designed to prepare HMS students who wish to join our JV or Varsity volleyball and/or basketball teams during the regular school year. Non-HMS students may enroll in this class to learn or fine tune their volleyball and basketball strategies.

Afternoon Classes for Grades K through 7

The afternoon program will be an organized program of enrichment activities. All students will have a chance to participate in every activity listed below by the end of the summer program. The students **do not choose** their afternoon classes.

Arts and Crafts – Let your imagination go wild with chalk, paints, yarn, string, foils, beads and recycled materials to create projects that will be appropriate for the student’s age level.

Chinese Culture - Using games, songs and other fun activities, students will be introduced to Mandarin language and Chinese culturally related activities.

Clay Building – Students will have the opportunity to be creative with clay as their canvas by hand-painting designs on a pre-made clay form.

Cooking for Fun – Students will have fun learning how to make simple and quick breakfast, lunch, dinner, desserts, and snack recipes.

Board Games – The students will have an opportunity to challenge other students and develop various strategies to compete successfully in board games including chess and checkers.

Exercise Time – The students will develop strength and stamina through aerobics, hip-hop, and other cultural dance classes.

Hawaiian Culture – The students will have fun learning Hawaiian words and phrases, playing Hawaiian games, and learning to play a simple tune on the ukulele.

Japanese Culture – Through Japanese games, songs, and other fun activities, students will be introduced to Japanese language and culture.

LEGO Challenge – Build your own robot, or a bridge, or even a castle using LEGO kits.

Martial Arts (Aikido and Karate) – Martial arts teaches children discipline through harmony of the mind and body. Self-discipline, coordination, balance, and concentration are some of the benefits from the martial arts experience.

Music Exploration – No formal instruments needed here. Making music using your feet and hands, tabletops, and coffee cans. Have fun making music and discover the joys of listening to music through our afternoon music hour.

Swimming – As part of the swimming program, children will learn water safety, receive swimming instructions in different strokes, and exercise to get into shape and have fun in the water safely.

Summer Sports – These exciting but separate classes include basketball, volleyball, tennis, and other appropriate group oriented sports. These classes offer a whole lot of fun while developing athletic skills that are age appropriate. Classes also promote an appreciation of sports and good sportsmanship.

Taiko Drumming - Get up and move to the beat of “Taiko”!!! Have fun learning basic drumming techniques and rhythms. Taiko emphasizes improving one’s listening skills and improving self-discipline.

Ohana Summer Arts Program: Ohana Summer Arts is an eight-week program (June 7th-August 1st) designed to provide an encouraging, non-competitive, and inclusive environment for kids ages 8-16 to develop performance skills, confidence, and a deeper appreciation for the arts. The **program meets daily** from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and includes daily workshops in voice, acting, and dance, as well as unique opportunities to work with professional teaching artists from New York City and Los Angeles. Each student will receive five 30-minute private voice lessons, group coaching sessions, and multiple opportunities for performance. Students will work together to put on a fully staged musical at the conclusion of the program. **Please note that all dress rehearsals and performances are mandatory, and will take place from July 19th-August 1st, tentatively scheduled to be at Kaimuki High School. ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR INTERNET ACCESS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Part 1: Responsible Internet and Network Use

The smooth operation of Hongwanji Mission School (HMS) network relies upon the proper conduct of the users who must adhere to strict guidelines. These guidelines are provided here so that you are aware of the responsibilities you are about to assume. In general this requires efficient, ethical and legal utilization of the network resources. If a HMS user violates any of these provisions, his or her account may be terminated and further access could possibly be denied. The signatures at the end of this document are legally binding and indicate the parties who signed have read the terms and conditions carefully and understand their significance.

*** Acceptable Use - the purpose of the Internet, which includes the use of e-mail, is to support research and education in this academic institution, by providing access to unique resources and the opportunity for collaborative work. The use of your account must be in support of education and research and consistent with the educational objectives of HMS. Transmission of any material in violation of any U.S. or state regulation is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to: copyrighted material, threatening or obscene material or material protected by trade secret. Use for commercial activities is generally not acceptable. Use for product advertisement or political lobbying is also prohibited.**

* Privileges - The use of the Internet is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use may result in a cancellation of that privilege. The system administrators in conjunction with the school administration and faculty will deem what is inappropriate use and their decision is final. Also, the system administrators may close an account at any time as required. The administration, faculty, and staff of HMS may request the system administrator to deny, revoke, or suspend specific user accounts. Additionally, the administration reserves the right to view a user's files on his/her account, as well as the usage of the computer (use of e-mail, web sites visited, programs or other material downloaded or used, etc.) through various available means.

* Network Etiquette - You are expected to abide by the generally accepted rules of network etiquette. These include (but are not limited to) the following:

* Be polite. Do not be abusive in your communications to others. Do not swear, use vulgarities or any other inappropriate language. Illegal activities are strictly forbidden.

* Do not reveal your personal address or phone numbers or those of other students or colleagues.

* During the normal school day, Desktop PC's are to be used as a tool to enhance the learning experience. **Therefore, while on school grounds, games, chatting, and sending e-mail to friends is prohibited unless otherwise directed by a teacher.** This is considered a class disruption and will be handled accordingly.

* Note that electronic communication is not guaranteed to be private. People who operate the system do have access to all communications and files. Communications related to or in support of illegal or inappropriate activities may be reported to the school, city, state, or federal authorities. Communications may not be encrypted so as to avoid security review.

* Do not use the network in such a way that you would disrupt the use of the network by other users.

* All communications and information accessible via the Internet should be assumed to be private property, and should be employed only for personal use unless permission of the author is obtained.

* Abusive messages to or about classmates and/or school staff will not be tolerated, even if they are produced and/or disseminated on school equipment or through networks which are not directly a part of HMS's technology systems. Nor will personal threats or harassment be permitted. The discipline policy of the school states that serious violations of HMS rules may result in probation, suspension, or expulsion. Inappropriate use of technology is considered to be a serious violation and will not be tolerated.

Part 2: User Accounts and Passwords

Students are issued **user accounts** and passwords to access the HMS network and profiles saved to the server. All work will be stored on the school's server; at no time will students be able to save to the Thin Clients. This insures the safety of the school's equipment and helps guard against loss of files. Each student and guardian/parent must agree and sign this contract. The signatures at the end of this document are legally binding and indicate the parties who signed have read the terms and conditions carefully and understand their significance. If a HMS user violates any of these provisions, the user's account may be suspended or terminated and further access could possibly be denied due to the severity of the incident. Full investigations by the administration will determine the course of action taken.

Sharing or taking of **passwords** is strictly prohibited. Any attempt to misuse the user accounts and passwords in any way, will suspend the user account and the accounts of the contributing parties. A full investigation will be conducted by the administration. Severe incidents will sanction the termination of user(s) accounts and/or denied use of HMS's computers and network.
